Annual Report of Bethune College 2020-21

We take great pleasure in presenting before this assembly a brief report of the activities and achievements of the College during the session 2020-21. As the First Women's College in Asia, this institution began its journey in 1879 with only one student Kadambini Ganguly (nee Basu), who subsequently went on to become the first woman physician in South Asia. As a flagship college of Calcutta University, Bethune College trains girl students to become responsible citizens, who can go beyond academic degrees to make lasting contributions to society, as worthy torch bearers of their glorious heritage.

Reaccredited in 2015 with 'A' grade, Bethune College strives to initiate new and innovative methods for quality enhancement, as per the recommendations of the NAAC Peer Team. We secured 88th rank nationally in the College Category in the assessment by National Institutional Ranking Framework (MHRD) in the current session.

Five of our departments namely Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Mathematics have been included under **DBT Star College Scheme**, of the **Department of Biotechnology**, **Ministry of Science and Technology**, **Government of India.** A **webinar was organised as part of the inaugural programme** on 18-09-2020.

From March 2020, the scare of the pandemic brought life to a stand-still. And, with the nation-wide lockdown putting a halt to normal life patterns, our college tried its best to ensure that the interests of students did not suffer. Teachers and non-teaching staff of the college quickly adapted themselves to the changed scenario and learnt technological skills for meeting academic and administrative needs

In the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic, just before the nation-wide lockdown, the Department of Chemistry, led by Dr. Amita Kar, Dr. Goutam Bandyopadhyay, Dr. Sulakshana Karmakar and Dr. Bimal Dirghangi (of Dept of Chemistry,) demonstrated the technique of <u>sanitiser</u> preparation to the teaching support staff. They prepared sanitisers which were distributed among faculty members and teaching support staff. Masks were also distributed and posters prepared by students were circulated online as part of the Covid awareness programme.

Online classes during lockdown

To effectively combat the extraordinary situation of a pandemic and subsequent lockdown, the College adopted open-source LMS solutions like Google Classroom, to conduct online classes for students. Classes were also carried out through email or WhatsApp. A special routine for

online classes during the Lockdown was prepared. Live Streaming of video classes on *Zoom/Google* meet/MTS/ Team-link/YouTube etc. was used to reach out to students more effectively. Additional remedial classes were arranged for students with network problems. A new section "Knowledge Repository" was added to the College website where study materials were uploaded regularly for the students. Open educational resource links provided by UGC were also uploaded in the College website along with other Open Educational Resource links.

Mental well-being of students:

The college ensured that students did not suffer from mental health issues during the long period of lockdown and to that effect organised webinars on mental health. Teachers of all departments kept in regular touch with their students during the lockdown. Special mention must be made of the Department of Psychology for providing mental support to the students, as and when required, to cope with the online teaching-learning system and emotional stress related to personal, family and financial issues during the pandemic. Dr. Nilanjana Bagchi provided online counselling to students with follow up sessions during the Covid-19 and post Aamphan period.

An In-House Faculty Development Programme by Trained Teachers (8 days): An eight-day in-house faculty development program titled "Online Teaching and E-content Development" was organized by IQAC, Bethune College from August 31, 2020 to September 7, 2020. Seventeen participants (including the Principal, Bethune College and one faculty member from each department of the college) were initiated in the use of different platforms for online teaching-learning, following the four-quadrant model. The lectures were delivered by trained in-house faculty of the college namely, Dr. Sutapa Datta, Dr. Suchandra Chowdhury and Dr. Anindita Datta.

This resulted in the Tuesday Lecture series which further enriched the teaching community. The series that was inaugurated by Principal, Prof (Dr) Krishna Roy in the form of an engaging discussion on Alzheimer's disease on December 3, 2019 has been carried forward with stimulating discussions on a variety of subjects by Dr Abhijit Bhattacharya, Dr Debalina Banerjee, Professor Pratap Ch Ray, Dr Kanya Sengupta, Dr Maitri Ghosh, Dr Suchandra Chowdhury, Dr Nilanjana Bagchi, Dr Anusua Datta and Smt Sanjukta Roy. Administrative work of the college remained undisturbed throughout this period owing to the Principal's initiatives.

- In keeping with the norms advocated by the University of Calcutta & Government of West Bengal, the college organised online verification of forms. The college maintains reservation of seats according to Government norms. Application and admission fees were collected online.
- Examinations of UG and PG, Annual & CBCS students were conducted online, including paper setting, evaluation and marks uploading.
- Arrears of 24 teachers were processed by the Arrear and Pay Fixation Committee in

- September 2020.
- CAS files of 10 teachers were processed in September 2020 by the CAS Committee and seven teachers have already received their orders.
- CAS files of 07 teachers were processed in February 2021.
- At the administrative level, the non-teaching staff members offered unstinting support to meet the challenges of a difficult year. The Students' Section provided wholehearted support in the digital processing of registration, examination and review related activities along with the various sub-committees and teachers. It was possible for the Income Tax, Pay Fixation and Arrear sub committees as well as other academic committees to process all administrative work owing to the full support and cooperation of the Office.

Infrastructural Support/Grants:

The latest addition to this heritage institution is the newly constructed Archive building. An Archive room is being set up for the preservation and display of rare documents and artefacts of the college. The same building also houses a room dedicated to Bethune College Sammilani.

Multi Facility Centres for Arts and Science have been set up to facilitate higher studies and research activities among students. The Multi-facility Centre for Science incorporates cutting edge instrumental facilities for research both at doctoral and post-graduate levels in bioscience. This DST-FIST sponsored centre is equipped with modern sophisticated instruments. Research work related to Nano Biotechnology conducted here has been recognized through publication and funding.

From 2016 onwards, the college has received a total financial assistance of Rs. 1,95,83,334/- from RUSA. The college utilized the full amount of the first instalment of RUSA grant for creation of new facilities, renovation and upgradation, and procurement of new equipments/facilities. From the second instalment, the state of the art Seminar Room has been completed. The third phase of allotment of Rs. 50 lacs is being used for creation of new facilities in the form of a single storeyed building with three storeyed foundation for extension of Chandramukhi Bhawan of which 50% of the work has been completed. (Rs. 4 lacs to be used)

STUDENT RESULTS and ACHIEVEMENTS:

The most important stakeholders are our students who have once again proved themselves worthy inheritors of the rich heritage of this college. Our student strength this session combining the undergraduate and postgraduate streams is close to 1500.

Extraordinary Achievements of students

Swarnali Dey who graduated with Botany Honours from this College in 2017 topped the All-India CSIR-UGC NET Examination 2020-2021.

Special mention must be made of Abhishikta Dhar, former student of Department of English (PG 2017) whose short film *Everyday Salad* was awarded **The Film with the Best Concept** at the Kolkata International Micro and Short Film Festival on 20/2/2021.

UG Results: During the last session, our students have performed very well in the University Examinations. The results of the undergraduate Arts departments of the college offering honours courses during the session 2020-21 was consistently good with as many as 82 students obtaining first class in B.A. Part III Honours examination. In the undergraduate science departments, 209 students were placed in the first class in the B.Sc. Part III Honours examination.

It is a matter of great joy for us that 3 students from the departments of Chemistry (02) and Statistics (01) have secured the prestigious **JBNSTS scholarship** *Bigyani Kanya Medhabritti* in 2020. 12 students of Chemistry and 3 students of Statistics are INSPIRE fellows.

PG Results and Student Progression:

Like our UG students, postgraduate students have also excelled in their academic performance with as many as 65 (Botany- 8 Psychology 10 Bengali 14, English 6, Maths 7, Zoo 20) securing first class marks in the Final Semester. We are proud to mention here that many of

our students have successfully cleared competitive examinations like **NET**, **JAM**, **JEST**, **GATE**, **CSIR NET**, **JRF IIT-ISM Entrance test** and a good number of them are pursuing PhD at prestigious institutes in India and abroad. Many of them have joined prestigious educational institutions like BARC, IITs and corporate offices in various capacities. Many of our students have joined West Bengal Education Service as Assistant Professor.

Academic Activities of Students:

The Institution takes several steps to nurture critical thought, creativity and scientific approach among the students. The students of all departments are encouraged to participate in various academic activities to facilitate learning beyond textbooks.

The importance of community service is impressed upon our students as it is our mission to impart holistic education, creating women who can contribute to the well-being of society. The NSS wing of the college involves the students in varied social activities.

NSS activities: Organised under the guidance of Dr. Moumita Datta From December 2019, drive was taken to make the College campus a Plastic free Zone by student-volunteers who distributed pamphlets to create awareness among all on the day of Fest, Aalap 2019. A Special Camp was held in March, 2020, the theme of which was Women Empowerment. Seminars were organized and renowned speakers came to deliver lectures. NSS Unit along with a NGO extended support to the poor people of Sundarban by distributing food items during the lockdown period.

STUDENT SUPPORT

The college actively promotes the outstanding schemes of Kanyashree and Swami Vivekananda Merit cum Means Scholarship designed by the Honourable Chief Minister of West Bengal and funded by the Government of West Bengal.

The Kanyashree Committee successfully processed the applications of 180 applicants (16 K1 applications and 164 K2 applications) of the previous portal: 2018-19. The Physical Verification of Documents of these candidates was carried out in a phased manner in the College campus by agents appointed by the ICDS, Kolkata. Applications were made for 172 candidates (5 K1 applications and 166 K2 applicants) during 2019-2020 portal. However, due to the exceptional circumstances created by the Covid pandemic, Physical Verification of Documents of the said candidates have not taken place.

185 applications for **Swami Vivekananda Merit cum Means Scholarship** were forwarded which include 26 K3 scholarships for PG students. Besides applications for the Indira Gandhi Scholarship for the Single Girl Child, Aikyashree, Minority Scholarships (SC/ST/OBC/Muslim) and National Scholarship were also processed.

Financially weaker students who fulfil the criterion for free studentship set by the Government of West Bengal Higher Education Department receive financial aid from the **Student Aid Fund** run exclusively by the teachers and different **Endowment Funds**. This year the Student

Aid Fund extended financial support to the **students affected by Amphaan**. Besides, 21 students from the outgoing batch and 41 students from the first semester have benefitted from the Students' Aid Fund.

The College **Library** that has a rich collection of about 1,10,500 books and journals. These include some rare and priceless books and journals thereby making the library a veritable learning resource for our students. In this session, the Library purchased books and journals worth Rs. 2,50,000- and Rs. 14,00,000/- was spent for purchasing equipments for library automation (RFID date). The Library also provides access to various scholarly journals through a subscription to Inflibnet.

Ethics and Value Education: With a view to promote holistic development of our students and to create awareness and commitment to moral values, the course on Ethics and Value Education has been reconstituted as a 30-hour course. A full-fledged syllabus, including contributions from all departments has been framed. WEBEL: Since 2006-07 **WBEIDC -WIL** division in collaboration with Bethune College offers a 120 hours on-campus DIPLOMA course in Computer Application, at a very affordable rate. It is held during College hours. Assessment of students is done based on a gradation system. Keeping the needs of students during lockdown, the course was shifted to online mode in the last session.

Excursions and Academic Tours: The teaching learning experience in the college is not confined to the four walls of the classroom.
