Programme Specific Outcome (PSO):

Semester 1

- CO2. Students learn about various cognitive aspects of psyche i.e., perception, learning, memory and also get firs- hand knowledge of the same through practicum.

CC-2: Statistical Methods for Psychological Research-I

- CO1. Students develop an understanding of the use of statistical methods in psychological research
- CO2. They learn the techniques of descriptive statistics for quantitative research.
- CO3. They develop and understand the need for quantification in Psychology

Semester 2

CC3: Biopsychology

- CO1. Students explore the biological basis of experience and behaviour.
- CO2. They develop an understanding of the influence of behaviour, cognition, and the environment on bodily system.
- CO3. Students develop an appreciation of the neurobiological basis of psychological function and dysfunction.

CC4: Psychology of Individual Differences

- CO1. Students develop an understanding of the concept of individual differences in terms with the goal to promote self-reflection and understanding of self and others along with Indian perspective of studying self-identity.
- CO2. They study about personality and human intelligence, their bio-psycho-social foundations and various approaches of studying the same.

Semester 3

CC5: Development of Psychological Thought

- CO1. Students are provided with a basic introduction to the development of the discipline both from the Indian as well as western perspective
- CO2. They review the development of psychological thought and introduce the issues and debates in contemporary psychology.

CC6: Psychological Research

- CO1. Students develop an understanding of the process and the methods of quantitative and qualitative psychological research traditions.
- CO2. They learn about different methods of data collection like observation, interview, focus group discussion, psychological testing along with use of secondary data.

CC7: Social Psychology

- CO1. Students develop an understanding of the individual in relation to the social world.
- CO2. They are introduced to the realm of social influence, as to how individuals think, feel and behave in social situations

SEC-A-01: Communication

- CO1. Students learn about the concept, nature and functions of communication along with its different facets in different contexts.
- CO2. They are acquainted with the knowledge of communication in organizational context, choice of communication channel, barriers to effective communication and persuasive communication.
