HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Established in 1879, Bethune College is the culmination of the dream project of J.E.D. Bethune and eponymous with generations of educated, enlightened and empowered women who have excelled in every sphere. Starting with the first women graduates, Chandramukhi Basu and Kadambini Ganguly, who went on to become the first Indian female Principal of Bethune College and the first practicing female doctor respectively, the institution has been one of the flagship colleges of the Government of West Bengal in terms of quality driven education. A painting of Dr. Kadambini Ganguly was unveiled recently in the college as a tribute to our illustrious alumna.

The college boasts of alumna like the celebrated revolutionaries Pritilata Waddedar, Kalpana Joshi and Bina Das. Leela Roy, was the only alumna from this college associated with the formation of the Indian Constituent Assembly. The mathematician Begum Fazilatunnesa Zoha, was the first female Muslim graduate of Bengal. Distinguished Bengali poet and social worker, Kamini Roy, was the first woman honours graduate of British India. The year 2022 marks the 150th Birth Anniversary of Sarala Devi Chaudhurani, educationist and political activist who was an illustrious ex-student of our college. Padma Bhushan, Dr. Ashima Chatterjee, the renowned scientist was also an alumna.

In the recent past, Dr Sanghamitra Bandyopadhyay received the Padma Shri in Science and Engineering (2021) and Dr. Aditi Sen De, the Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar award (2018). Dr. Neena Gupta, also a Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar awardee (2019) and Ramanujan Prize winner for Young Mathematicians (2021), a mathematical prodigy who solved the unresolved 'Zariski Cancellation Problem' was also awarded "Nari Shakti Puraskar" by the President of India on March 8th,2022. Priyadarshini Das, a national level table tennis



player and Swarnali Dey who has secured an AIR 1 in the Joint CSIR UGC NET JUNE 2020, have made the college very proud.

The college boasts of eminent and erudite scholars, who served in the capacity of lecturers at different times. Among the luminaries we have Baboo Shashi Bhushan Dutt, Kamini Ray, Begum Fazilatunnesa Zoha, Sri Krishna Chandra Bhattacharya, Sri Gopinath Bhattacharya, Sri Sushobhan Sarkar and many others. Stalwarts like Sir Ashutosh Mukherjee, Lady Abala Basu, Sri Radha Binode Pal have served as committee members of the Governing Body of the college at different times. Today the college has a dedicated team of teachers who consistently upgrade and update themselves through active participation in research, publications, seminars and workshops.



The earliest Honours Courses offered in the college were in Sanskrit (1880) and English (1890). These courses received affiliation from the University of Calcutta in 1917. In 1923, the college got affiliation at the I.Sc. level and Mathematics and Philosophy were added to the list of Honours subjects. Today, the college has affiliation in 16 Honours subjects, and 6 Post Graduate courses.

The present total roll strength (Arts and Science together) is approximately 1400 and the number of sanctioned posts in teaching is at 108. In addition, there are 7 posts for State Aided College Teachers (SACT). Bethune College continues its journey as the pioneer institution of women's education, spanning a period of 143 years.

OUR CAMPUS

The college is located in a prime position, in the heart of North Kolkata, situated opposite to Hedua (now known as Azad Hind Bagh) and is accessible by public transport. One can also reach the college by Metro railway. The college is a five minutes' walk from Girish Park Metro Rail Station.

The campus consists of the following buildings:

ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING, the oldest heritage building of the campus, has the Principal's chamber and the college office. It also houses the Department of Economics and a seminar room funded by RUSA on the first floor.





VIDYASAGAR BHAVAN, also a heritage building that houses the Departments of English, Bengali, Sanskrit, Hindi, Political Science, History, Philosophy, Mathematics, Computer Science & Laboratories of Physics department. The Annexe building houses the Statistics Department on the first floor and Computer Laboratory, Sports Room on the ground floor in addition to several classrooms.

CHANDRAMUKHI BHAVAN, inaugurated in 1961 by Prof. Satyendra Nath Bose, accommodates the departments of Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology.

KADAMBINI BHAVAN, presently houses the Psychology Department, Arts Library, part of the Chemistry Department and part of Postgraduate Laboratories of the Zoology and Botany Departments and the Centenary Hall. The vertical extension of Kadambini Bhavan contains the NAAC room, and a few class rooms.

PRITILATA BHAVAN, inaugurated in 2010 to commemorate the birth centenary of our alumna, Smt. Pritilata Waddedar, the renowned freedom fighter, provides classrooms for several departments and also laboratories for Botany and Zoology Departments.

NIVEDITA BHAVAN, located beside Kadambini Bhavan, accommodates a common room on the ground floor and a gymnasium on the first floor.

ARCHIVE BUILDING, located between Chandramukhi Bhavan and Kadambini Bhavan houses College Archives. A bust of John Elliot Drinkwater Bethune has been installed there in memory of his 175th year of arrival in India.

AUDITORIUM BUILDING, located beside Chandramukhi Bhavan, was inaugurated in 2019. It accommodates Science Library on the ground floor, a need based class room, a few other class rooms in other floors and an auditorium.

STUDENTS' SUPPORT SYSTEM

- ◆ Students' Hostel: A New Girls' Hostel of Bethune College with 150 seats at a prime location in the vicinity of Karunamoyee Salt Lake has been inaugurated recently. Students who will be admitted in this college are eligible to apply for the hostel. Students are also eligible to apply for seats at Calcutta University Undergraduate Girls' Hostel.
- ◆ Students' Common Room: The Nivedita Building houses a new and upgraded students' common room with all amenities and some indoor games facilities available for students.
- ◆ **Gymnasium**: Situated on the first floor of Nivedita Building is a RUSA supported fully equipped gymnasium with bi-cycle, ergo meter, twister, ladies' cycle and jogger.
- ◆ Sports Facilities: The College sports room has arrangement for games like carrom, chess and table tennis. There is also a Badminton Court in the college campus. A guest trainer is usually engaged to train the students in different sports activities. The College organizes the Annual Sports in its own play ground in the winter every year. Besides this, the College also participates in various inter-college and district-level sports events and has many prizes to its credit.
- ◆ Career Counselling and Placement Cell: Career Counselling Cell of the College organizes campus recruitment drives through which a good number of students are placed in different Corporate Houses like TCS and Cognizant each year. The cell also conducts interactive seminars and workshops on career guidance and presentation skills.
- ◆ Right to Information: The College has an Information Officer to whom the students and the staff may seek help regarding the rules of RTI (Right to Information).
- ◆ Backward Class and Minority Cell: This Cell works towards creation of awareness regarding social equality to prevent any actions which create disharmony in society or discriminate against any individual or section of society.
- ◆ Internal Complaints Committee (ICC): The college has an Internal Complaints Committee constituted according to UGC Notification (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of women employees and students in higher educational Institutions Regulations, 2015) to prevent and take appropriate action against sexual harassment in the institution. This committee headed by the Principal has both male and female representatives from teaching as well as non-teaching staff and also student representatives.










- ◆ Anti Ragging Cell: Ragging is strictly prohibited in Bethune College as per UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions,2009 (under section 26(1)(g) of the UGC Act 1956). An Anti-Ragging Cell has been constituted according to UGC norms. Starting 2017, all Anti-Ragging Declaration forms are to be submitted online at www.antiragging.in
- ◆ Grievance Redressal: The College has a strong grievance redressal system. Depending on the nature of

grievance, students may seek redressal from the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC), the Disciplinary & Grievance Committee, the Anti Ragging Committee and the Backward Class Cell. Students may register their complaints / grievances / suggestions (if any) physically in the college 'Grievance Box' or may fill up the Grievance Form available on the college website. ◆ Students' Aid Fund : The students' aid

fund is enriched with contribution made by the Principal, teachers and students. Examination fees and tuition fees are provided to the economically disadvantaged and needy UG and PG students from this fund after receiving proper application. Arrangements for special stipends are made from time to time on

grounds of merit and pecuniary condition of the students from this fund.

- 2. **Kanyashree**: All students attaining eighteen years of age and unmarried are eligible to apply for Kanyashree grant. There is no upper limit on the family income to apply for Kanyashree grant. Students must contact the Kanyashree Committee of the College and also follow the notices displayed on the College notice board.

Kanyashree recipients (K2) pursuing P.G courses in science and arts with a minimum of 45% marks in aggregate in the U.G level may apply for the same.

Photocopy Centre College Canteen : Since 2006 the College has maintained an active NSS unit with student volunteers and teacher members. The regular, special and red-ribbon activities are organized under the guidance of teachers and some recognized non-government organizations. Activities include special camp, orphanage and slum visits, awareness programs on World AIDS Day, World Toilet Day, Thalassemia, Orthopedic and other health issues, campus cleanliness drives, old cloth distribution, health camp, programmes for creating awareness regarding environment and human rights.

The NSS unit also conducts a Certificate Course for UG students on 'Bratachari - A cultural Heritage of Bengal' in collaboration with Bengal Bratachari Samiti.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Students are not entitled to receive books from the Library without ID cards. The loss of membership cards should be immediately reported to the Librarian. A fine will be charged for a fresh card.
- 2. Students will be provided with two Home issue and one Day Issue card in general.
- 3. Books lost, damaged, or defaced must be replaced by the borrower. If such a book is one of a series and is not available separately, the whole set must be replaced by the borrower.
- 4. The borrower's card is returnable at the end of the session and is strictly non transferable.
- 5. Students leaving the College for the University Examinations must return the library books and the cards and get a clearance certificate from the Librarian before receiving admit cards for B.A. / B.Sc. and M.A. / M.Sc. final semester examinations.
- 6. Books must be returned within a fortnight from the date of issue. Defaulters will have to pay a fine and will lose the right to borrow books till the fine is paid.
- **Departmental Library:** This library provides easy access of texts and reference books to students of the departments.
- **Book Bank:** In addition to the departmental library, the departments also maintain a book bank for students.
- **Archive**: The institution has preserved a large number of rare historical documents and memorabilia in the newly constructed archive building. Among the rare documents are papers related to the establishment of the college, Movement against the Simon Commission, Pritilata Waddedar's free studentship and Kalpana Joshi's statement while serving a term of imprisonment.






CERTIFICATE COURSES FOR U.G. STUDENTS

- ◆ Computer Training Course: A TWO YEARS DIPLOMA COURSE IN COMPUTER APPLICATION is conducted by WEBEL INFORMATICS LTD (Under Dept of Information Technology, Govt of West Bengal) for all newly admitted students (classes held according to routine within college hours). All students are advised to take admission in this course. A fee of Rs. 2400 for the entire course for two years is charged per student.
- ♦ ? Ethics and Value Education: Bethune College conducts a 30 hours compulsory certificate course on Ethics and Value Education for all students of 1st and 2nd semester with a nominal fee of Rs 100/- The objective of this course is to create awareness, conviction and commitment of the students to social and moral values, for improving the quality of life through education. Evaluation is done at the end of the course and a certificate is awarded to the students on successful completion of the course.

Students can join the course with a nominal fee of Rs. 100/-.



RESEARCH AND ACADEMIC EXTENSION PROGRAMME

* Students' Exchange Programme: The Postgraduate Department of English had organised a Students' Exchange Programme with the PG Department of English, Hooghly Mohsin College from June 2021 to April 2022.

The Department of History has initiated a Students' Exchange Programme with the Department of History, Scottish Church College. The agreement was signed on 17-5-2022.

- * DBT Star College Scheme: Five departments of the college, namely Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Mathematics have been included under DBT Star College Scheme, of the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India since September, 2020. Till date all five departments have organised several seminars, webinars, workshops and faculty development programmes. Students of these departments have also submitted posters and projects.
- * Departmental Seminar: All the Departments organise at least two departmental seminars in each session as part of co-curricular activities by eminent speakers in the respective fields. All students are to attend the seminars of their respective departments mandatorily.
- **Tuesday Lecture :** Tuesday lectures series encourage interdisciplinary academic exchange among teachers. Beginning on December 3rd 2019, a total of 20 lectures have been organized till date.



Ethics and Value Education





* Educational Tours and Excursions: As per rule of the University of Calcutta, Botany, Zoology, Psychology and History departments take their students on excursions related to academic projects in their respective areas. The charges of excursions are to be paid by the students separately. At least one faculty member accompanies the students on excursions.

Besides the compulsory excursions, other departments also organise educational trips to places of historical and cultural significance. Students are also taken to various symposiums, seminars and workshops, research institutes and exhibitions pertaining to their subjects of study.





WOMEN'S STUDIES CENTRE



The Women's Studies Centre organizes gender sensitization and awareness programmes. The Annual Gender Sensitization Plan is uploaded to the college website and the Centre and departments attempt to abide by the plan. The College has introduced Women's Studies as a subsidiary subject since the year 2012.

HUMAN RIGHTS CELL

The cell was established in December 2020 with the purpose of creating awareness amongst our students regarding human rights, its upkeep and violation. Since its formal inauguration in June 2021, the cell has organized various awareness programmes and seminars. 
COLLEGE PUBLICATIONS

The Department of Statistics released an e-magazine containing students' writings on National Science Day, February 28, 2021.



THREE YEAR UNDERGRADUATE COURSE

Since the academic session of 2018 the three years undergraduate course is being conducted under the new. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as adopted by the University of Calcutta.

- ♦ **Session:** The Academic Session commences from July every year with the odd semesters, namely, 1st, 3rd and 5th semesters. According to University stipulations, classes for the next semester will start immediately after seven days of the completion of the previous semester's examination.
- ♦ Course of Study: The B.A / B.Sc Degree course offers B.A/B.Sc. Honours and associated generic elective courses. The college admits students only in the Honours Course.
- ♦ The College offers to teach the following subjects:

Honours (Arts): English, Bengali, Sanskrit, History, Philosophy, Psychology, Political Science and Hindi.

Honours (Science): Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology, Botany, Computer Science, Psychology, Economics and Statistics.

Generic Elective (Arts): English, Bengali, Hindi,

Sanskrit, History, Philosophy, Psychology, Economics, Political Science and Women's Studies.

Generic Elective (Science): Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Botany, Mathematics, Computer Science, Statistics and Economics.

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC)

AECC 1 : Communicative English / Major Indian Language (Bengali/Hindi) (Compulsory for all First Semester students).

AECC 2: Environmental Studies (Compulsory for all Second Semester students).





ADMISSION TO THREE YEAR DEGREE COURSE

(All information regarding current admission is available in www.bethuneadmissions.ac.in)

Students who have passed Higher Secondary, ISC, CBSE, or its equivalent examinations both in India and abroad, approved by the University of Calcutta are eligible to apply. Candidates from Vocational Stream are not eligible to apply. Admission process is conducted entirely in online mode.

RULES

- 1. A candidate may apply for a maximum of four Honours subjects. Separate applications must be submitted for each Honours subject.
- 2. The College does not offer any three years General Degree Course.
- 3. SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B candidates from only West Bengal are eligible for reservation benefits. SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B candidates from Other States will be treated as General Category candidates in the Merit List.
- 4. Admission to any course of the College is provisional and is subject to final approval of University of Calcutta.
- 5. Anti-ragging declaration as per UGC norm is to be mandatorily submitted through online by every student after admission, failing which the registration process will not be initiated.
- 6. A girls' hostel of the college located at Salt Lake may be made available for the outstation students.
- 7. Admission will be made strictly in order of merit.

ADMISSION OF SC / ST / OBC (A) AND OBC (B) CANDIDATES

- SC/ST/OBC candidates from West Bengal only are eligible for reservation benefits. SC/ST/OBC candidates from other states will be treated as General Category candidates as per (Govt. order No. 905 - TW / EC dated 12th Sept. 1995 and EDN No. 437/2014 dated 2nd April, 2014). 22% and 6% of total number of seats in each Honours subject shall be reserved for SC and ST candidates respectively.
- 2. The rules of interchangeability is followed. If adequate number of ST candidates are not available, seats can be filled up by SC candidates and vice versa.
- 3. The candidates included in general merit list should not be counted towards reserved seats.
- 4. Each SC/ST candidate should secure at least 40% marks in the subject or related subject in previous qualifying examination.
- 5. An SC or ST candidate should secure Index mark which is not lower by more than 25% from the Index mark obtained by the last candidate of the General Category getting admission. An OBC-A / OBC-B candidate having Index mark lower by more than 10% from the Index mark obtained by the last admitted candidate of General Category will not be admitted.









ADMISSION OF PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED CANDIDATES

5% of seats are reserved in each category for Candidates with Disabilities (PWD) (with minimum 40% disability) in terms of G.O.No. 1084(20)-Edn(U)/EH/1U-89/13 dated 07-12-18 of Dept. of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal.

- 4. Aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks of the BEST FOUR subjects (at least 100 marks paper). Marks in compulsory Environmental Education / Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of Aggregate marks.
- 5. Admission will be conducted strictly on the basis of merit.

B.Sc. (Hons.): Rs. 2071.00 (Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Psychology (B.Sc.),

Mathematics, Computer Science, Statistics & Economics Honours).



OUTLINE OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

A) Core Course (CC) : In B.A. /B.Sc. (Honours) programme a student shall have to compulsorily study a total of 14 Core courses of the Honours Subjects in 6 semesters.

B) Elective Courses:

- i) Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: A student shall choose any one paper from each of Group A and Group B in fifth semester and sixth semester ie total 4 DSE courses in the Honours subjects.
 - ◆ Dissertation/Project: A dissertation/ project work may be given in lieu of one Discipline Specific Elective paper.
- ii) Generic Elective (GE) Course: A student shall have to choose 4 Generic Elective (GE) courses strictly from 2 subjects of choice, taking exactly two courses from each subject as specified for first 4 semesters.
- C) Ability Enhancement Courses (AECC): The Ability Enhancement Courses (AECC) may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).
 - a) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): These are mandatory for all disciplines.
 - i) AECC1: Communicative English / MIL (Bengali/Hindi); in 1st Semester.
 - ii) AECC2: Environmental Studies in 2nd Semester.
 - b) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): A student shall have to study 2 skill enhancement courses (SEC) in the Honours subject, ie SEC-A in the 3rd semester and SEC-B in the 4th semester.
- ◆ Practical/Tutorial: Every Core Course(CC), Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) and Generic Elective (GE) Course shall have a Practical/Tutorial component. Wherever there is a Practical, there will be no Tutorial and vice-versa.

CODE OF CONDUCT

RULES RELATING TO ATTENDANCE

- ♦ The College strictly abides by the attendance norms of the University of Calcutta as follows:
- ♦ End Semester Examinations will be held for 80% of the total marks in each paper and Internal Assessment shall be for 20% of the total marks of each paper/subject/module. 50% of the total marks assigned to Internal Assessment (i.e., 10 marks for a full paper of 100 or 5 marks for a Module of 50, as the case may be) will be assessed on the basis of Internal Examination and remaining 50% (i.e 10 marks for a full paper of 100) will be assessed based on the class attendance (6 marks for attending 60% or above but less than 75% of the number of lectures delivered; 8 marks for attending 75% or above but less than 90% of the number of lectures delivered; and 10 marks for attending 90% or above of lectures delivered and such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission whichever is later).
- ♦ Students with attendance below 60% cumulatively in all courses in a semester are not eligible to appear in the respective Semester Examination.
- ♦ It is mandatory to attend online classes whenever arranged by the Departments due to various reasons.





BETHUNE COLLEGE SAMMILANI (ALUMNI ASSOCIATION)

The Alumni Association of Bethune College was established by G.M Wright, the then Principal of the college, on 3rd September, 1921. This is the oldest Alumni Association among all Government Colleges in West Bengal. This Alumni Association is run by an Executive Council elected by the members themselves. A unique feature of Bethune College Sammilani is that not only the past students but also the present and past teachers are eligible for membership. Their association with Bethune College often spans their entire student and teaching life.

The association also participates in various social service programmes. Every year an interactive session between the alumnae

Bethune College has a record of consistent and excellent academic results. There were 6 students in Science securing CGPA above 9 (1 from Chemistry and 5 from Computer Science). 


