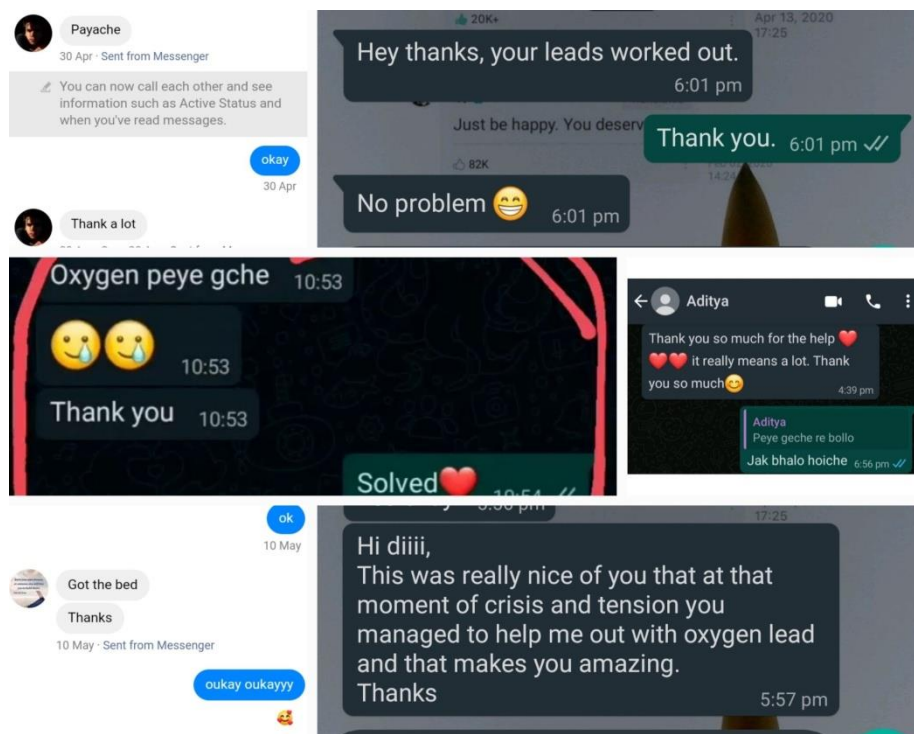


Report: Bethune College COVID Squad

28th June, 2021

The country has been severely affected by the second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic. With thousands of people being infected daily in our state itself, standing by people and helping them is the need of the hour. Keeping such a thought in mind, the Bethune College COVID Squad initiative was started under the banner of Students' Activity Cell, Bethune College, on 28 April, 2021, with roughly twelve students from semesters four and six. We had started with the purpose of providing help to the families of the students and staff of our college. However, as the group expanded, it started to extend help to people from all over the state. Currently, the group consists of 60 student volunteers and has been able to help almost 150 people till date with help of all kind, from oxygen cylinders and hospital beds to food facilities and RTPCR tests and lot more.

As a student of Bethune College, I am really proud that my respected Professors and a few of our seniors have taken this wonderful initiative to help people in these distressing times and am grateful to be a part of this inspiring team. I pay my owe to our respected Principal Ma'am for her continuous support and motivation which acted as a stimulating dose in our work.

Indeed we have slept with tears in our eyes. We have prayed for the speedy recovery of some

stranger who we've never seen in our life, neither will we probably. We have cried over the unfortunate loss of some stranger.

We have also seen the evil side of human nature during these days. We have seen oxygen cylinders being sold at sky-high prices, lifesaving drugs like Remdisivir being hoarded and hospital beds costing at prices which can push families into poverty. However, as Susan Gossell has said, *"There is good and there is bad in every human heart, and it is the struggle of life to conquer the bad with the good"*, we grew stronger than ever before. We learnt how to fight against all odds and stand by those who needed us. Oindrila Mitra, a sixth semester student of the English Department and one of our volunteers, beautifully mentions all these in her short writeup on her experience in these few days.

"The Voice of another Internet Warrior..."

At the heart of the Covid-19 Pandemic when the entire Country witnessed a doubling in the number of Covid Cases we have seen a wave of solidarity across the World. Being a Student of Bethune College I started off my day by verifying and forwarding leads for Oxygen Cylinders, Concentrators, ICU Beds, Food and Blood Banks! Equipped with just smartphones and an internet connection, me and my squad made an attempt to cut through the dark and thus, mobilized our efforts and channeled our time to seek for various resources for those battling with COVID-19! While responding to the calls and messages was becoming increasingly difficult, figuring out what ICU bed is required for a particular oxygen saturation level with absolutely no resources backing was fretful!

Also, the grievances lodged against the selling of Oxygen Cylinders at exorbitant prices, the illegal hoarding of drugs like Remdisivir and Tocilizumab and extortion of a huge sum of money from the patient's party for a cure in the midst of Pandemic further augmented my worries after a certain point of time!

And now when the desperate pleas for Oxygen Cylinders and our sleepless nights have lessened, I realized that by Volunteering I undertook a transformational journey where one travels an extra mile to extend a helping hand to others."

Technology has indeed been a blessing in disguise for all of us. With a smartphone in hand and an internet connection to support us, the amount of help that we have been able to impart is satisfying at times. To be able to save even one life has put smiles of pride on our faces and given us a night's sleep of immense peace. Dhrubaa Roy Chowdhury's writeup on her experience gives us a perfect insight into each of our feelings during these days.

"Volunteering for Covid"

Being a Covid Volunteer is a tall order. Waking up every morning with calls and texts from troubled and exhausted people who are in dire need of an oxygen cylinder, for their family and friends is a tough row to hoe. During the past several weeks, we got plenty of calls from people, looking for aid and it was difficult to hold back tears as they narrated the horrifying situation they were facing during the ongoing pandemic and the medical emergency crisis.

With our limited resources, we tried our best to help every person who reached out to us. The hardest part of it all was turning down requests. When someone told us how they called several oxygen suppliers or hospitals, only to be turned down, it took us everything within ourselves to tell them that we are

helpless. Days of a Covid Volunteer are coloured with morbid news. But, when we hear the relieved voice of the person who we were able to help, it rejuvenates us. It means a lot to know that we could do something to save at least one life out of the thousand ailing ones and it motivates us to tackle the coming hurdles with a renewed spirit.

Experiences are seldom happy for us. I remember that night when I was helplessly trying to contact hospitals, looking for an ICU bed for my friend's aunt, only to hear that she took her last breath the following morning. I think about that poor family, who couldn't afford an oxygen cylinder for their grandfather as it cost them their entire year's earnings. I remember telling a fellow volunteer, "IT COSTS RS.75, 000 TO BREATHE!" In such situations, all I could do was stare at the increasing number of daily cases and pray for better days.

However at the end of the day, even if I can save one, I sleep peacefully at night, though I know I couldn't save so many others. And the image of smiling faces of people after their dear ones are recovering is a constant encouragement for us to continue with our volunteering purpose."

Dhrubaa is a second semester student from the Department of Botany and one of our volunteers. We end this report with an amazing writeup by Srijani Das, a fourth semester student from the History Department.

এসে দাঁড়াও, ভেসে দাঁড়াও এবং ভালোবেসে দাঁড়াও,
মানুষ বড় কঁাদছে, তুমি মানুষ হয়ে পাশে দাঁড়াও।" -

আজ থেকে দেড় মাস আগে যখন সারাদিন টেলিফোন অপারেটর মত কেবল ফোন করে যেতাম আর ফোন পেতাম, তখন দিনের শেষে কিংবা শুরুতে যখন ঘুমতে যাওয়ার ফুসরত পেতাম, শক্তি চট্টোপাধ্যায়ের এই লাইনগুলো বলে নিজেকে শক্ত করতাম। বারবার সকাল হলে মনে হত, এ কোন সকাল রাতের চেয়েও অন্ধকার! যেখানে একটা চেনা কারুর ফোন বেজে উঠলে আনন্দের চাইতে ভয় হত বেশি! মনে হত এই বুঝি কারুর জন্যে বেড খুঁজতে হবে! এই বুঝি অক্সিজেনের অভাবে কারুর শেষ নিঃশ্বাসের খবর পাবো। পেয়েওছি সেসব। মধ্যরাতে এক পৃথিবীর মানুষ যখন শান্তির ঘুমে আচ্ছন্ন, তখন সেই সুকান্ত ভট্টাচার্যের রানারের মত আমরা কেবল ছুটে বেরিয়েছি শহরের এক হাসপাতাল থেকে আরেক হাসপাতালে। এক অক্সিজেন ডিলার থেকে অন্যর কাছে হাত পেতে নিঃশ্বাস নিয়েছি কথায়, অনুন্নে। নাহ! রানারের মত লণ্ঠন হাতে রাস্তার এগলি সে গলি ছুটে যেতে পারিনি। করোনাসুর রাস্তার সব মোড়ে দাঁড়িয়ে থেকেছে। আমরা স্বার্থপরের মত, ভীতুর মত সে চোখকে ভয় পেয়েছি। এ আমাদের ব্যর্থতা নাকি সীমাবদ্ধতা- এ উত্তর বড়ো কঠিন! দুনিয়াকে হাতের মুঠোয় এনে দেওয়া ফোন আজ না থাকলে এ কাজ কিভাবে হতো, জানা নেই। মুঠোফোন যে কেবল অভিষাপ না, আশীর্বাদ ও, এ কথা এ সময় বুঝিয়ে দিয়েছে। ভোর রাতে চোখে ঘুম নেমে এসেছে হয়তো, ফোন এলো - " পিপি, আর লাগবেনা ওষুধ। বাবা চলে গিয়েছে।" - শুনে তখন স্থির স্থবির হয়ে যেতাম। সমস্ত অস্থিরতা থমকে যেত। মনে হত কেন খুঁজলাম এত! পারলাম না, কিছুই পারলাম না! স্থির হতে হতে যখন ঘুম নেমে আসত, ভোরের পাখির আওয়াজের সঙ্গে আবার যখন একটা ফোনে কেউ বলত, - " এইই কালকের পাঠানো অক্সিজেনে দিদির স্যাচুরেশন বেড়েছে অনেকটাই..", তখন ফের মনে হত, কবীর সুমন পাশ থেকে হেসে বলছেন, " হাল ছেড়ো না বন্ধু, বরং কণ্ঠ ছাড়ো জোরে

তোমায় আমায় দেখা হবে, অন্য গানের ভোরে.. " নতুন ভোরের গন্ধে সমস্ত পুরনো ব্যর্থতা মুছে না গেলেও সেসবকে সঙ্গী রেখেই নতুনের মাইভঃ এ মেতে উঠে আবার কাজ শুরু করেছি রোজ। আবার হাসপাতালো ফোন করেছি, খুঁজেছি কোথায় আইসিউই/ নন আইসিউ কোভিড বেড আছে। পেশেন্টের ফোন করে বোলছি, চিন্তা না করতে। সব ঠিক হওয়ার আশ্বাস দিয়েছি, দুচোখ ভরে নতুনের স্বপ্ন দেওয়ার চেষ্টা করেছি। কখনো বা ফোন করে খাবার পৌঁছে দিয়েছি, সারা বাড়ি যাদের করোনা গ্রাস করেছে। কখনো বা ব্লাড ব্যাংকে ফোন করে করে খোঁজ নিয়েছি প্লাজমা বা রক্তের খোঁজে, বন্ধু বান্ধব আত্মীয়দের মধ্যরাত্রে ফোন করেছি, অনুরোধ করেছি রক্ত দেওয়ার জন্যে। প্রাণডিন্কা করেছি বছর। বেশিরভাগই সেই অনুরোধ শুনে মুখের ওপর দরজা বন্ধ করে দিয়েছেন। " অন্যের রক্ত লাগবে, আমি কেন দেব.. " - এ কথা শুনে মানুষের ওপর আসা টলে গিয়েছে বছর। যদিও ব্লাড ডোনেশন নিয়ে বছর দেড়েক কাজ করে এ অভিজ্ঞতা নতুন নয়। শেষে নিজেই এগিয়ে যাই। ক্যাম্প খুঁজে রক্ত দি গান গাইতে গাইতে। এর মধ্যে অক্সিজেন ও ওষুধ নিয়ে চোরা বাজারি দেখেছি। ভয়ে আরো আরো কুঁকড়ে গেছি। রানারের মত প্রশ্ন করেছি নিজেকে, "ভোর তো হয়েছে-আকাশ হয়েছে লাল

আলোর স্পর্শে কবে কেটে যাবে এই দুঃখের কাল?" ।

অন্ধকার কেটেছে। আজ সেই হাহাকার কমেছে প্রায় ৬০% । তবুও এখনো মৃত্যুর খবর শুনে সপ্তাহে বেশ কিছু। ঘরের জানলা খুললে মাঝরাতে, ঘরের পাশের শ্মশানের পুড়তে থাকা দেহের গন্ধে গলার কাছে কান্না গেঁথে গিয়েছে। তবুও, বেঁচে থাকি বারবার, সেই কবীরের কথায় ভর দিয়ে।
