HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Established in 1879, Bethune College is eponymous with generations of educated, enlightened and empowered women who have excelled in every sphere. Starting with the first women graduates, Chandramukhi Basu and Kadambini Ganguly, who went on to become the first Indian woman Principal of Bethune College and the first practicing woman doctor respectively, the institution has been the one of the flagship colleges of the Government of West Bengal in terms of quality education.

Bethune College has been awarded "A+" in the 3rd cycle of NAAC. The quantitative and qualitative accreditation is based on quality and performance in terms of curricular aspects, teaching-learning process, faculty research, infrastructure, student support, and other criteria. The college has also secured 91st rank nationally in the College Category in the assessment by the National Institutional Ranking Framework (MHRD) in 2024.

The college boasts of alumni like the celebrated revolutionaries Pritilata Waddedar, Kalpana Joshi and Bina Das. Leela Roy, was the only alumna from this college associated with the formation of the Indian Constituent Assembly. The mathematician Begum Fazilatunnesa Zoha, was the first female Muslim graduate of Bengal. Distinguished Bengali poet and social worker, Kamini Roy, was the first woman honours graduate of British India. Sarala Devi Chaudhurani, educationist and political activist was an illustrious exstudent of our college. Padma Bhushan, Dr. Ashima Chatterjee, the renowned scientist was also an alumna.

In the recent past, Dr. Sanghamitra Bandyopadhyay received the Padma Shri in Science and Engineering (2021) and Dr. Aditi Sen De, the Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar award (2018). Dr. Neena Gupta, also a Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar awardee (2019) and Ramanujan Prize winner for Young Mathematicians (2021), a mathematical prodigy who solved the

unresolved 'Zariski Cancellation Problem' was also awarded "Nari Shakti Puraskar" by the President of India on March 8th, 2022. Priyadarshini Das, a national level table tennis player and Swarnali Dey who has secured an AIR 1 in the Joint CSIR UGC NET JUNE 2020, have made the college very proud. The legacy continues and students of the college have been consistently performing very well in academics and other spheres, as well. The college aims at providing holistic education at a nominal cost, empowering women as responsible global citizens. Bethune College has a record of consistent and excellent academic results. Many students, since the inception of the college, have topped University merit lists and won many medals and honours from the University. In the last session, 215 UG students secured CGPA over 6 in Humanities & Social Sciences and 133 UG students secured CGPA over 7 in Science subjects. Special mention must be made of 06 students in Humanities and Social Sciences who secured CGPA over 8 (02 from Philosophy, 02 from Psychology and 02 from Sanskrit). There were 06 students in Science securing CGPA above 9 (2 from Statistics, 02 from Mathematics and 01 from Botany and Zoology each). PG results were equally good with as many as 44 students securing CGPA over 6 in their final semester.

The college boasts of eminent and erudite scholars, who served in the capacity of lecturers at different times. Among the luminaries we have Baboo Shashi Bhushan Dutt, Kamini Ray, Begum Fazilatunnesa Zoha, Sri Krishna Chandra Bhattacharya, Sri Gopinath Bhattacharya, Sri Sushobhan Sarkar and many others. Stalwarts like Sir Ashutosh Mukherjee, Lady Abala Basu, Sri Radha Binode Pal have served as committee members of the Governing Body of the college at different times. Today the college has a dedicated team of teachers who consistently upgrade and update themselves through active participation in research, publications, seminars and workshops.

The earliest Honours Courses offered in the college were in Sanskrit (1880) and English(1890). These courses received affiliation from the University of Calcutta in 1917. In 1923, the college got affiliation at the I.Sc. level and Mathematics and Philosophy were added to the list of Honours subjects. Today, the college has affiliation in 16 Honours subjects, and 6 Post Graduate courses.

The present total roll strength (Arts and Science together) is approximately 1217 and the number of sanctioned posts in teaching is at 110. In addition, there are 6 posts for State Aided College Teachers (SACT) Bethune College continues its journey as the pioneer institution of women's education, spanning a period of 145 years.

Bethune College, the first women's college in Asia, continues to retain its position as a premier institution, largely owing to the consistently good performances and achievements of our students in various spheres, aided by the guidance of devoted, competent teachers and support staff.

The college offers scope for achieving academic excellence, as well as, developing skills in a variety of areas, through participation in the different clubs of the Students' Activity Cell, and through add on courses. The NSS Unit of the college is very active and students learn to care for the community, while pursuing individual goals. The aim is to provide holistic education, so that our students emerge as self-sufficient, responsible and compassionate human beings.

OUR CAMPUS

The college is located in a prime position, in the heart of North Kolkata, situated opposite to Hedua (now known as Azad Hind Bagh) and is accessible by public transport. One can also reach the college by Metro railway. The college is a five minutes' walk from Girish Park Metro Rail Station.

The campus consists of the following buildings:

ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING

The oldest heritage building of the campus, has the Principal's chamber and the college office.

VIDYASAGAR BHAVAN

It is also a heritage building that houses the Departments of English, Bengali, Sanskrit, Political Science, History, Philosophy, Mathematics, Computer Science & Laboratories of Physics department. The Annexe building houses the Statistics Department on the first floor and the Hindi Department, Computer Laboratory, Chemistry Laboratory, Sports Room on the ground floor in addition to several classrooms.

CHANDRAMUKHI BHAVAN

It was inaugurated in 1961 by Prof. Satyendra Nath Bose, accommodates the departments of Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology.

KADAMBINI BHAVAN

It presently houses the Psychology Department, Economics Department, Arts Library, part of the Chemistry Department and part of Postgraduate Laboratories of the Zoology and Botany Departments and the Centenary Hall.

PRITILATA BHAVAN

It was inaugurated in 2010 to commemorate the birth centenary of our alumna, Smt. Pritilata Wadder, the renowned freedom fighter, and it provides classrooms for several departments and also laboratories for Botany and Zoology Departments.

NIVEDITA BHAVAN

It is located beside Kadambini Bhavan, accommodates a common room on the ground floor and a gymnasium on the first floor.

ARCHIVE BUILDING

It is located between Chandramukhi Bhavan and Kadambini Bhavan houses College Archives. A bust of John Elliot Drinkwater Bethune has been installed there in memory of his 175th year of arrival in India. Archive building also has dedicated Alumni room.

AUDITORIUM BUILDING

It is located beside Chandramukhi Bhavan, and was inaugurated in 2019. It accommodates the Science Library on the ground floor, a few other classrooms on other floors and an auditorium. The Science library has an ecosystem aquarium.

ADMINISTRATION

GOVERNING BODY

The college is under the West Bengal Higher Education Department. Bethune College has a Governing Body constituted by nominees from the Government of West Bengal, Calcutta University, teaching staff, non-teaching staff and students. INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

It is an active body that conducts academic audits of the Departments annually, takes feedback from the final year students, alumni and teachers on various academic and administrative issues and also conducts Students' Satisfaction Survey. Besides this, the cell also prepares the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) that is sent to NAAC.

DEPARTMENTS

The College has 17 undergraduate departments combining both the Arts and Science faculties where Honours courses (except in Women's Studies) and associated generic elective courses are taught. No independent general course curriculum is offered to students. Six of these departments also conduct Post-Graduate courses affiliated to the University of Calcutta.

A New Girls' Hostel of Bethune College with 150 seats at a prime location in the vicinity of Karunamoyee Salt Lake is currently functioning since July 2022. Outstation students who will be admitted in this college are eligible to apply for hostel accommodation. Students are also eligible to apply for seats at Calcutta University Undergraduate Girls' Hostel. There is a Govt.bus for the students to commute between Hostel and College.

Students' Common Room:

The Nivedita Building houses a new and upgraded students' common room with all amenities. Some indoor games facilities are available for students.

Gymnasium:

Situated on the first floor of Nivedita Building is a RUSA supported fully equipped gymnasium with bi-cycle, ergometer, twister, ladies cycle and jogger.

Sports Facilities:

The College sports room has arrangement for games like carrom, chess and table tennis. There is also a Badminton Court in the College campus. A guest trainer is usually engaged to train the students in different sports activities. The College organizes the Annual Sports in its own play ground in the winter every year. Besides this, the College also participates in various inter-college and district-level sports events and has many prizes to its credit.

Career Counselling and Placement Cell:

Career Counselling Cell of the College organizes campus recruitment drives through which a good number of students are placed in different corporate Houses like TCS and Cognizant each year. The cell also conducts interactive seminars and workshops on career guidance and presentation skills.

Right to Information:

The College has an Information Officer to whom the students and the staff may seek help regarding the rules of RTI (Right to Information).

Backward Class and Minority Cell:

This Cell works towards creation of awareness regarding social equality to prevent any actions which create disharmony in society or discriminate against any individual or section of society.

Internal Complaints Committee (ICC):

The college has an Internal Complaints Committee constituted according to UGC Notification (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of women employees and students in higher educational Institutions Regulations, 2015) to prevent and take appropriate action against sexual harassment in the institution. This committee has both male and female representatives from teaching as well as non-teaching staff and also student and scholar representatives.

Anti Ragging Cell:

Ragging is strictly prohibited in Bethune College as per UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 (under section 26(1)(g) of the UGC Act 1956).

An Anti-Ragging Cell has been constituted according to UGC norms. Starting 2017, all Anti-Ragging Declaration forms are to be submitted online at www.antiragging.in by the students.

Grievance Redressal:

The College has a strong grievance redressal system. Depending on the nature of grievance, students may seek redressal from the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC), the Disciplinary & Grievance Committee, the Anti Ragging Committee and the Backward Class Cell. Students may register their complaints / grievances / suggestions (if any) physically in the college 'Grievance Box' or may fill up the Grievance Form available on the college website. The Grievance Redressal policy document is also uploaded on the college website for general information.

Students' Aid Fund:

The students' aid fund is enriched with contribution made by the Principal, teachers and students. Examination fees and tuition fees are provided to the economically disadvantaged and needy UG and PG students from this fund after receiving proper application. Besides, arrangements for special stipends are made from time to time on grounds of merit and pecuniary condition of the students.

Students' Committee:

Each year, a Students' Committee is formed under the Students' Activity Cell with the Principal as its President for the smooth functioning of co-curricular and extra-curricular activities of the students like intra-class competition, annual sports and annual fest (AALAP). The representatives of the Students' Committee are nominated by the Principal and the teachers.

Regular activities include literacy, health and skill development programs at the adopted slum Goabagan, orphanage visit, awareness programs on World AIDS Day, World Toilet Day, Thalassemia, Health issues, Health camps, campus cleanliness drives, old cloth distribution, programmes for creating awareness regarding environment and human rights, partcipation of NSS Volunteers at State and National level programs and camps.

The NSS unit also conducts two Certificate Coursse for UG students-'Bratachari-A cultural Heritage of Bengal' in collaboration with Bengal Bratachari Samiti and 'Handicraft and Art Work' with Women's Christian College, Kolkata.

- Photocopy Centre: The students can avail of photocopy facility at a low price.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE LIBRARY

- 1. Students are not entitled to receive books from the Library without ID cards. The loss of membership cards should be immediately reported to the Librarian. A fine will be charged for a fresh card.
- 2. Students will be provided with two Home issue and one Day Issue card in general.
- 3. Books lost, damaged, or defaced must be replaced by the borrower. If such a book is one of a series and is not available separately, the whole set must be replaced by the borrower.
- 4. The borrower's card is returnable at the end of the session and is strictly non transferable.
- 5. Students leaving the College for the University Examinations must return the library books and the cards and get a clearance certificate from the Librarian before receiving admit cards for B.A. / B.Sc. and M.A. / M.Sc. final semester examinations.
- 6. Books must be returned within a fortnight from the date of issue. Defaulters will have to pay a fine and will lose the right to borrow books till the fine is paid.
- Departmental Library: This library provides easy access of texts and reference books to students of the departments.



College Library

- Book Bank: In addition to the departmental library, the departments also maintain a book bank for students.
- Archive: The institution has preserved a large number of rare historical documents and memorabilia in the newly constructed archive building. Among the rare documents are papers related to the establishment of the college, Movement against the Simon Commission, Pritilata Waddedar's free studentship and Kalpana Joshi's statement while serving a term of imprisonment.

The four years undergraduate course will be conducted under the new CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK(CCF, 2022) as adopted by the University of Calcutta.

- Admission to the college is made strictly on the basis of merit following the declared reservation criteria of the government.
- The entire application and admission process will be online. The applicants or their representatives need not come to the college physically for any enquiry or for any other purpose till the completion of the admission process.
- As per Govt. order no application fee is required to be paid by the applicants.
- Validity of application is subject to fulfillment of minimum eligibility criteria and uploading of required documents within the stipulated date and time.
- Admission to the college is granted on the understanding that the student undertakes to conform in all respects to the rules and discipline of Bethune College and the University of Calcutta.

Session: The B.A./ B.Sc. Programme shall be for a minimum duration of Eight (08) (with an exit option after completion of 2nd/4th/6th Semesters) consecutive semesters of Six months each, i.e. The odd semester will start ordinarily in the month of July and the even semester in the month of January of every year.

A student pursuing a regular course of study for semester wise degree course shall have to clear all semesters in all respects within a span of seven years from the year of admission to the particular course and combination, failing which enrolment of the student shall stand cancelled.

Courses of Study: The college offers only 4 year B.A./B.Sc. (Honours with or without Research) course at UG level.

The College offers to teach the following subjects:

A. Discipline Specific Core Course (DSCC)

Major (**Arts**): English, Bengali, Sanskrit, History, Philosophy, Psychology, Economics, Political Science and Hindi.

Major (Science): Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology, Botany, Computer Science, Psychology, Economics and Statistics.

B. Minor (Arts): English, Bengali, Hindi, Sanskrit, History, Philosophy, Psychology, Economics, Political Science and Women's Studies.

Minor (Science): Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Botany, Mathematics, Computer Science, Statistics and Economics.

C. Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):

- a) Compulsory English
- b) Major Indian Language (MIL) (Bengali/ Hindi)

D. Skill Enhancement Course (SEC):

Two SECs based on major subjects in 1st and 3rd semester, in 2nd semester Artificial intelligence for Science Discipline and Digital Empowerment for Humanities and Language Discipline or as specified in the syllabus of the concerned major subject.

E. Common Value Added Course (CVAC):

Total of four CVAC courses, one compulsory CVAC in ENVS and one in Constitutional values in the 1st semester. In 2nd semester one compulsory CVAC in ENVS and one from a pool of courses.

F. Summer Internship:

At the end of 2nd or 4th or 6th semester.

G. Interdisciplinary Course (IDC):

Three IDCs to be studied in the first 3 semesters. IDC course other than major and minor subjects are to be chosen.

H. Research/Dissertation:

Students securing 75% marks after first 6 semesters may opt for Honours Degree course in the 7th and 8th Semester. Students not pursuing research shall have to take up one additional DSCC in 7th semester and two additional DSCC in 8th semester.

General Information and Requirement for Admission:

- Only Female candidates are eligible to apply.
- The college offers only 4-year B.A./B.Sc. (Honours with or without Research) course at UG level.
- A candidate who passed the Higher Secondary or its equivalent Examination (10+2 level) in 2021 to 2024 from any recognized Board is eligible to apply for admission to the B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) courses.
- Candidates who passed in Vocational Stream are not eligible to apply for Honours Courses.
- A candidate must have passed in English (full marks not being less than 100) in the previous qualifying examination to apply for B.A / B.Sc. (Honours) Courses.
- Aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks of the BEST FOUR subjects (at least 100 marks paper). Marks in compulsory Environmental Education / Studies will not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks.
- Admission will be conducted strictly on the basis of merit. The subject wise merit lists will be prepared based on corresponding INDEX MARK for all categories of students.
- Admission to Semester-wise 4-Year B.A./B.Sc. (Honours with or without Research) Degree Courses under Curriculum and Credit Framework, 2022 (CCF, 2022) under the University of Calcutta will be guided by Admission Regulations (Notification No. CSR/05/2023 dated 23/06/2023) of the University of Calcutta.
- Admission to any course of the college is provisional and is subject to verification of required original documents and final approval of the University of Calcutta.

- Anti-ragging declaration as mandated by the UGC is to be submitted online by every student after admission, failing which the registration process will not be initiated.
- A Girls' Hostel of the College located at Karunamoyee, Salt Lake is available for outstation candidates. Candidates who want to avail hostel facility may contact college office after admission. Registration fee for Hostel-Rs.1000/- (one time, non-refundable) and Monthly hostel charge for lodging with two major meals are Rs.5200/- (subject to modification as and when required). The procedure for application for hostel will be available in the college website in due time.

Reservation of seats:

- Reservation Policy for Admission will be guided by the "West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission), Act 2013 and Rules, 2014" and "Reservation of Economically Weaker Section (EWS) in admission in the Higher Educational Institutions in the state of West Bengal (Memo No.-339-Edn(CS)/OM-74L/2023 dated 26/05/2023)". Number of Reserved seats for Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST), OBC-A, OBC-B and Economically Weaker Section (EWS) are shown against each Honours subject.
- SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B candidates from only West Bengal are eligible for reservation benefits. SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B candidates from Other States will be treated as General Category candidates in the Merit List.
- EWS certificate issued by competent authorities of Govt. of West Bengal in the current financial year will only be considered for reservation under EWS category.
- At present reservation of seats are as follows

 7% and EWS 10%

Special conditions for taking up Major Courses according to the above mentioned University Notification are as follows:

- i) **Economics:** A Student shall be allowed to take up Major in Economics if the candidate has passed in Mathematics at the H.S. Examination (10+2) conducted by the West Bengal Council of H.S. Education or its equivalent examination in Mathematics/ Business Mathematics/ Applied Mathematics. Students who have passed Business Economics including Business Mathematics in H.S.(10+2) level from West Bengal Council of H.S. Education are also eligible for admission with Economics as the Major subject, students of Economics Major have to take up Mathematics as one of the Minor subject
- ii) **Mathematics:** A student shall be allowed to take up Major in Mathematics if the candidate has passed in Mathematics/ Applied Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination. A student who has passed in Business Mathematics is not eligible for admission to the Mathematics Major Course.
- iii) **Chemistry:** A student shall be allowed to takeup Major in Chemistry if the candidate has passed in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.
- iv) **Philosophy:** If the student has not studied Philosophy as a subject in the previous qualifying examination then Psychology/ Mathematics/ Education/ Sociology/Political Science be treated as related subjects.
- v) **Computer Science:** The combination of subject for Computer Science Major Course shall be Mathematics as one of the Minor subjects and any one of the subjects: either Physics or Statistics or Electronics as the other Minor subject.

Outline of CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK (CCF 2022):

Category of Courses:

A) Discipline Specific Core Course (DSCC): A course, to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core requirement of the Major subject.

All students shall have to take 22 DSCs of one subject. In addition, students who do not qualify or opt for "4-year degree course-by research, will have to take three additional courses with provision for project based evaluation (As mentioned in the syllabus of respective subject).

Although the course contents of all minor courses are identical with some major courses of that subject, the examinations for Major and Minor courses will be conducted separately.

B) Minor: A subject of same broad discipline to be studied by the student with lesser number of courses other than the major subject.

Course content to be the same, as Major Courses of a given standard.

A student will have to take 8 Minor Courses from the same broad discipline as the Major excluding the Major subject. Students have to study 4 Minor Courses in the first two years (1)

in each semester) and 4 Minor courses in the 3rd year (2 in each semester).

Of the 4 courses in the first two years2 courses have to be taken from one subject (m1) in the 1st and 2nd semesters and 2 courses from the other subject (m2) in the 3rd and 4th semesters. All these courses are intended to be at level 100.

The exact Minor courses are specified in the syllabus of respective subjects. For any minor subject the first two minor courses (irrespective of whether it is taught in 1st or 2nd year) will be identical with the first two courses of the corresponding major subject.

In the third year (semester-5 & 6) two minor subjects in each semester will have to be taken from two different subjects. These courses are of level 200.

A minor course opted for in the 5th semester will have to be selected from among the major courses offered in the 3rd semester level (level 200).

Similarly a minor course opted in the 6th semester will have to be selected from among the major courses offered in the 4th semester (level 200).

- C) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):
 Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) courses are the courses based on the knowledge of languages. There shall be two AEC courses: a) Compulsory English b) MIL/ Alternative English MIL includes: Bengali, Hindi & Urdu.
- D) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses are designed to provide skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing competencies, skills etc. SEC courses are based upon skill enhancement. Student shall study 2 SECs based on Major subjects in 1st and 3rd semester. In the 2nd semester the student can

- study Artificial Intelligence (for Science discipline) or Digital Empowerment (for Humanities & Language discipline) or as specified in the syllabus of the concerned Major subject.
- E) **Practical**/ **Tutorial**: All courses other than AEC & CVAC will have one Practical/ Tutorial. Wherever there is a practical, there will be no Tutorial and vice-versa. Inclusion of P/TU components in SECs will be decided by the concerned UGBOS.
- F) Common Value Added Course (CVAC): These courses are based on Knowledge of Human & Social Values. There shall be 4 CVAC courses of 2 credits each. In the 1st semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & one compulsory CVAC in Constitutional Values. In the 2nd semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & the students shall select the other CVAC from a pool of courses. G) Summer Internship: All the students are required to do one 3 credits Summer Internship at the end of the 2nd or 4th or 6 th semester. Students completing Internship at the end of the 2 nd semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded a Certificate of 45 credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 4th semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded a Diploma of 88 credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 6th semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded a three-year Single major Degree of 132 credits.
- G) Summer Internship: All the students are required to do one 3 credits Summer Internship at the end of the 2nd or 4th or 6th semester. Students completing internship at the end of the 2nd semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded a Certificate of 45 credits. Students completing internship at the end of the 4th semester will be





allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded a Diploma of 88 credits. Students completing internship at the end of the 6th semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded a three year Single major degree of 132 credits.

- H) Interdisciplinary Course (IDC): There shall be 3 IDCs of 3 credits each, to be studied in the first 3 semesters. The students shall take IDC from the different subjects other than the Major and Minor subjects.
- Research/ Dissertation: a) Students obtaining CGPA equivalent to 75% marks after successful completion of all the first 6 semesters may opt for Honours with research

Degree Course in the 7th & 8th Semester. b) Students choosing a 4-year Bachelor's degree (Single major with Research course) are required to take up research projects under the guidance of a faculty member. The students shall have to complete the Research in the 7th & 8th semester of 4 credits and 8 credits respectively (total 12 credits). c) Students pursuing 4-year Single major Degree without Research shall have to take up to 1 additional DSCC (should be a Project work/ dissertation & the course will be of 4 credits) in 7th semester and 2 additional DSCCs (courses are of 4 credits each and at least one should be a Project Report/ Seminar) in 8th semester.
